Note on Etiquette as Summer Draws Near: As Orthodox Christians, we strive to follow the apostle's admonition, 'let all things be done decently and in order.' A clear extension of this teaching is that all Christians--men, women, and children--dress modestly, particularly in the context of church services. Another principle, so intrinsic to Orthodoxy, is the idea that we offer God our very best, not merely what is convenient or comfortable. Our dress--and indeed our entire way of carrying ourselves in church--should help us recall our sacred vocation to be holy. Here are some practical guidelines to a amplify these theological foundations:

- **★**Modest Sensibility
- $\bigstar$  Absolutely No Logos (large or small)
- ★Make the Lord's Day Special (making allowance for coming from work in evenings)
- **★**Wear Long Pants (or skirts for ladies)
- $\bigstar$ Shoulders Covered (no tank tops or spaghetti straps)
- ★ Avoid Wearing T-shirts, in general
- **★**No Lipstick
